



Job Search Assistance at Ohio's Libraries

Ohio is the first state in the nation in which all local employment centers are working in partnership with their local libraries. This means that if you'd like in-person, one-on-one help finding a job, you can get it at either your local OhioMeansJobs center or your local library.

Ohio has nearly 500 public libraries in towns, cities, and neighborhoods across the state. The specific services offered at each will vary, but they could include any of the following:

- Access to **OhioMeansJobs.com** on library computers
- Trained librarians available to help you use **OhioMeansJobs.com**
- Workshops on interviewing and other job search skills

- Job fairs, recruitments and/or other hiring events
- Brochures and information about such things as:
 - Job openings at local companies
 - Local in-demand careers
 - How to write a powerful resume
 - How to access training programs to enhance job skills

Working together, Ohio's libraries and the OhioMeansJobs centers have made it easier for Ohioans to find jobs, improve their skills and advance in their careers.
